Are you interested in joining the City of Lansing's Arts and Culture Commission? The City is currently seeking individuals who meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Strong interest in art and the Lansing community
- Live or work in the City of Lansing or serve Lansing residents, preference for Lansing residency
- Arts practitioner
 - Artist/Cultural Entrepreneur
 - Arts Administrator
 - Arts Educator
- Service on Nonprofit Boards, Community Advisory Boards, Other Government Boards & Commissions
- Preference for those non-MAACC Members currently serving on a MAACC committee
- Individual's background is reflective of the diversity of the community

Mayor's Arts and Culture Commission Members are expected to make the following commitments:

- Attend six (6) MAACC meetings each calendar year (generally held the 1st Thursday of every other month – January, March, May, July, and September – at 3:00 p.m.)
- Actively serve on at least one (1) MAACC Committee – current MAACC Committees include:
 - Arts Education
 - Campus & Community Relations
 - Communication & Advocacy
 - Facilities & Infrastructure
 - Governance
 - Grants
 - Public Art
 - Talent & Economic Development
- Serve as an Ambassador of the MAACC and arts & culture in the community by being committed to recognizing, promoting, and celebrating the positive impact that arts and culture has on the local economy; be engaged in building community infrastructure; and support mechanisms for celebration of the City of Lansing's heritage and diversity and opportunities for lifelong learning.
- Attend arts & culture-related events in the City of Lansing, and greater Lansing region.
- Sign a Confidentiality & Conflict of Interest Statement.
